## **Last of Trinity**

"What do you want me to do for you?" (Mark 10:51)

Have you ever felt that life was just passing you by? Today's Gospel is an invitation to allow yourself to be seen by Jesus with all your vulnerability. This passage is a brilliant conclusion to a section central to Mark's Gospel on discipleship. This begins with the gradual, secret healing of a blind man in Mark 8: 22 - 26. Today's passage concludes this section with a full, public healing at the gate of Jericho before Jesus goes on his way to Jerusalem.

Mark pulls out all the stops to deliver this story as a fast paced, action-packed narrative, typical of the earlier chapters in his Gospel. But rather than drawing your attention to these Marken tricks, I would rather you spend time on your own in prayer with this passage. You might like to imagine yourself as Bartimaeus the only person named who is healed. The first blind man at first sees only shadows, people walking around like trees. Bartimaeus is able to see Jesus straight away because of his faith, not prior discipleship or learning.

Bartimaeus is vulnerable but also has strength and agency. He is not used by Mark as a merely passive recipient of Jesus' power. In response to Jesus' call He jumps up, throws off his cloak and comes to Jesus. Jesus asks him what he wants.

May I encourage you to tell God what you want God to do for you as you pray with this passage. As you take in the vivid details and inhabit the story, notice what happens to you in prayer and talk to God or someone you trust about this.
